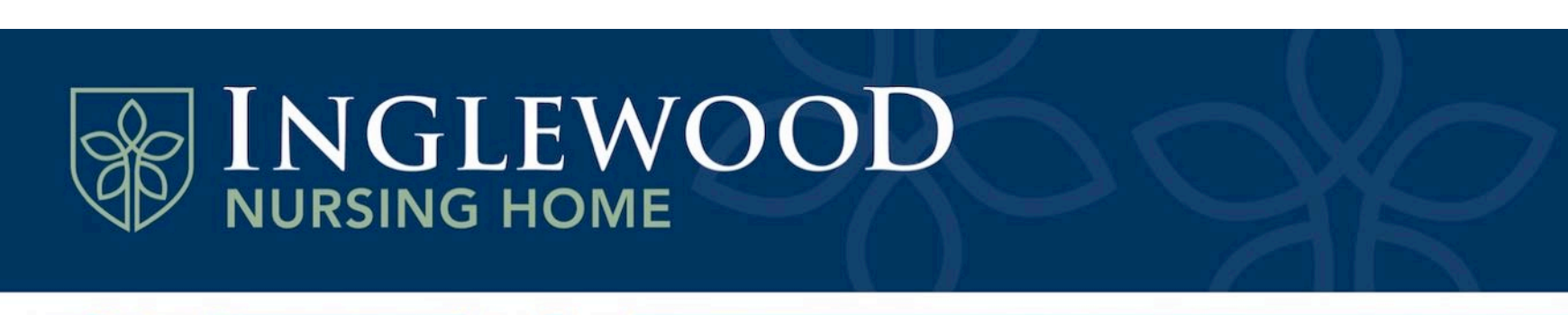




INTRODUCTION

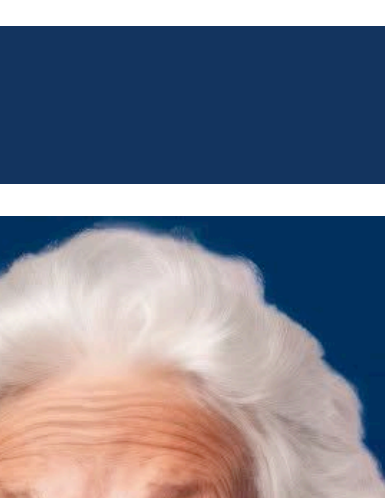

The gardening sessions have been a wonderful opportunity to enjoy the fresh air, spend time outdoors and take pride in watching our plants develop throughout the summer.

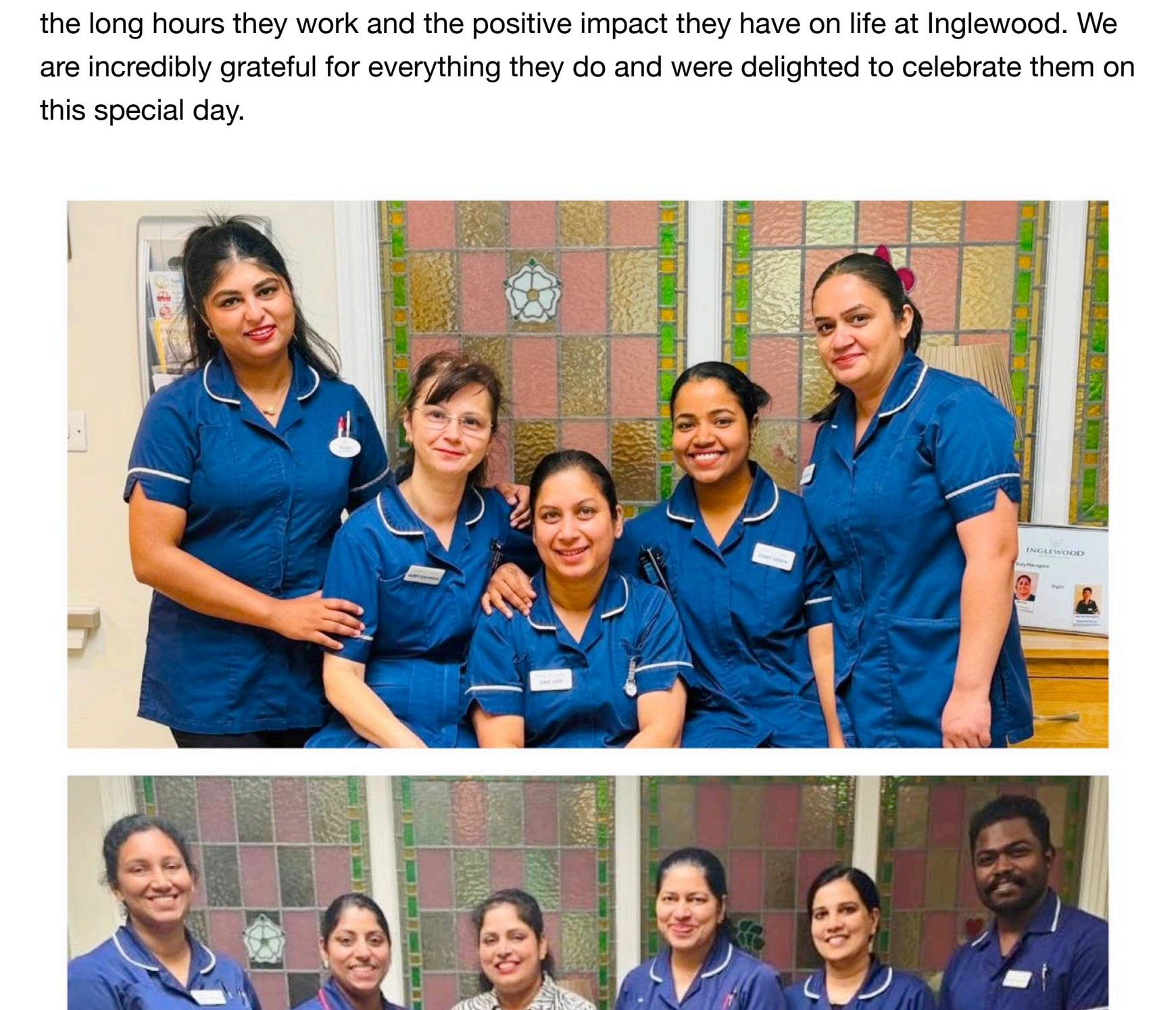


Celebrating International Nurses Day

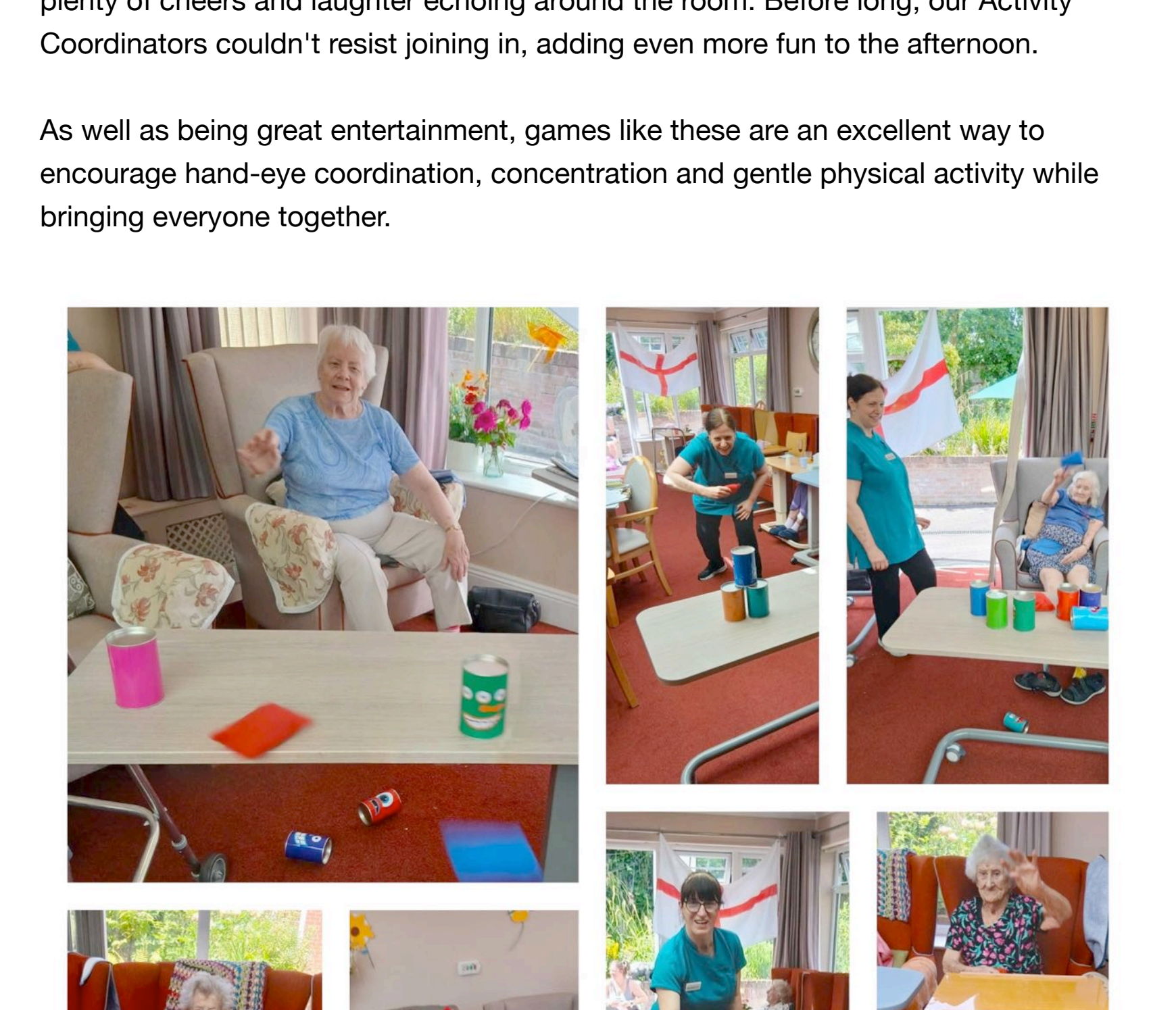


A Friendly Game of Tin Can Alley

As well as being great entertainment, games like these are an excellent way to encourage hand-eye coordination, concentration and gentle physical activity while bringing everyone together.

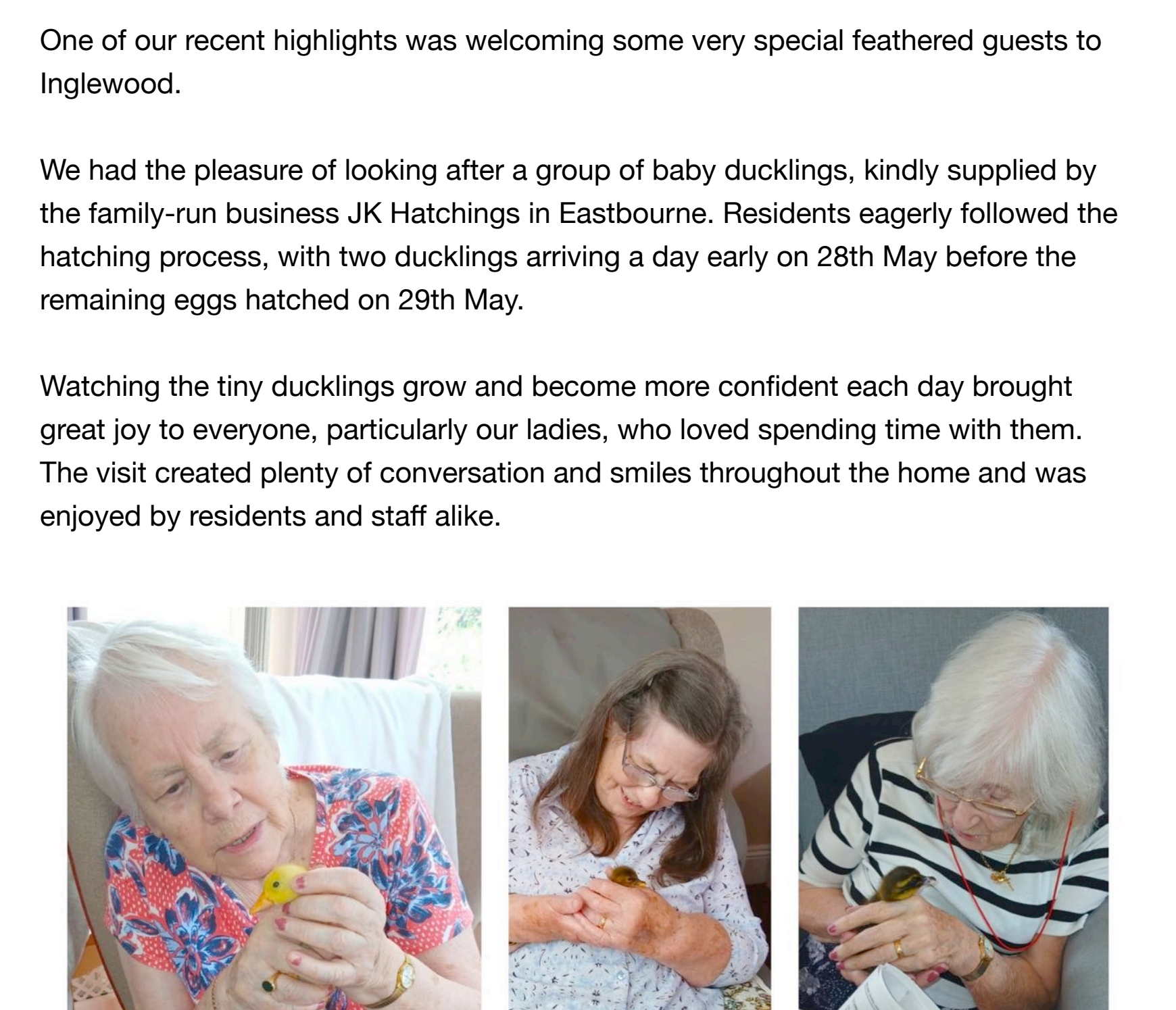


Welcoming Some Very Special Visitors

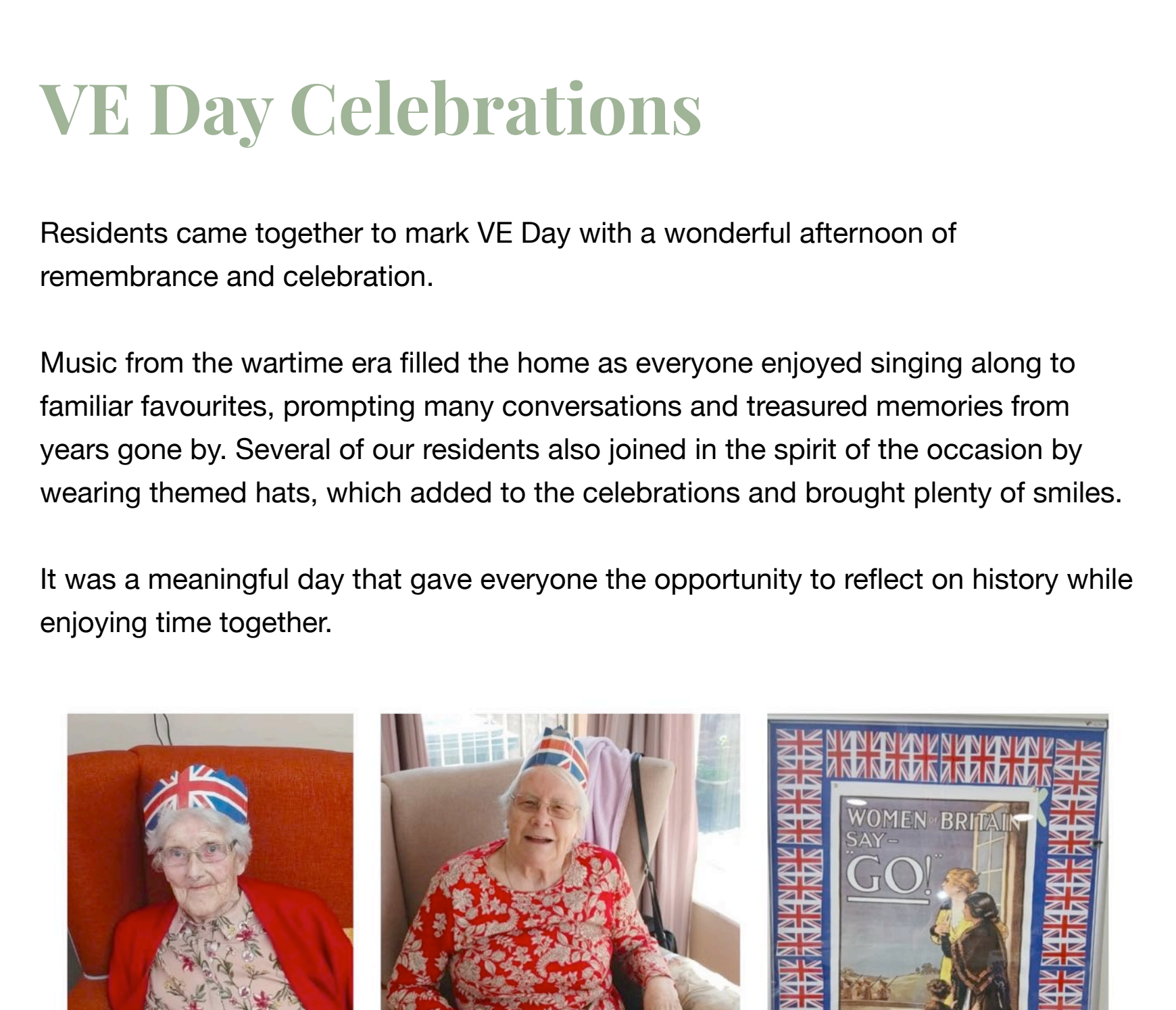


VE Day Celebrations

It was a meaningful day that gave everyone the opportunity to reflect on history while enjoying time together.

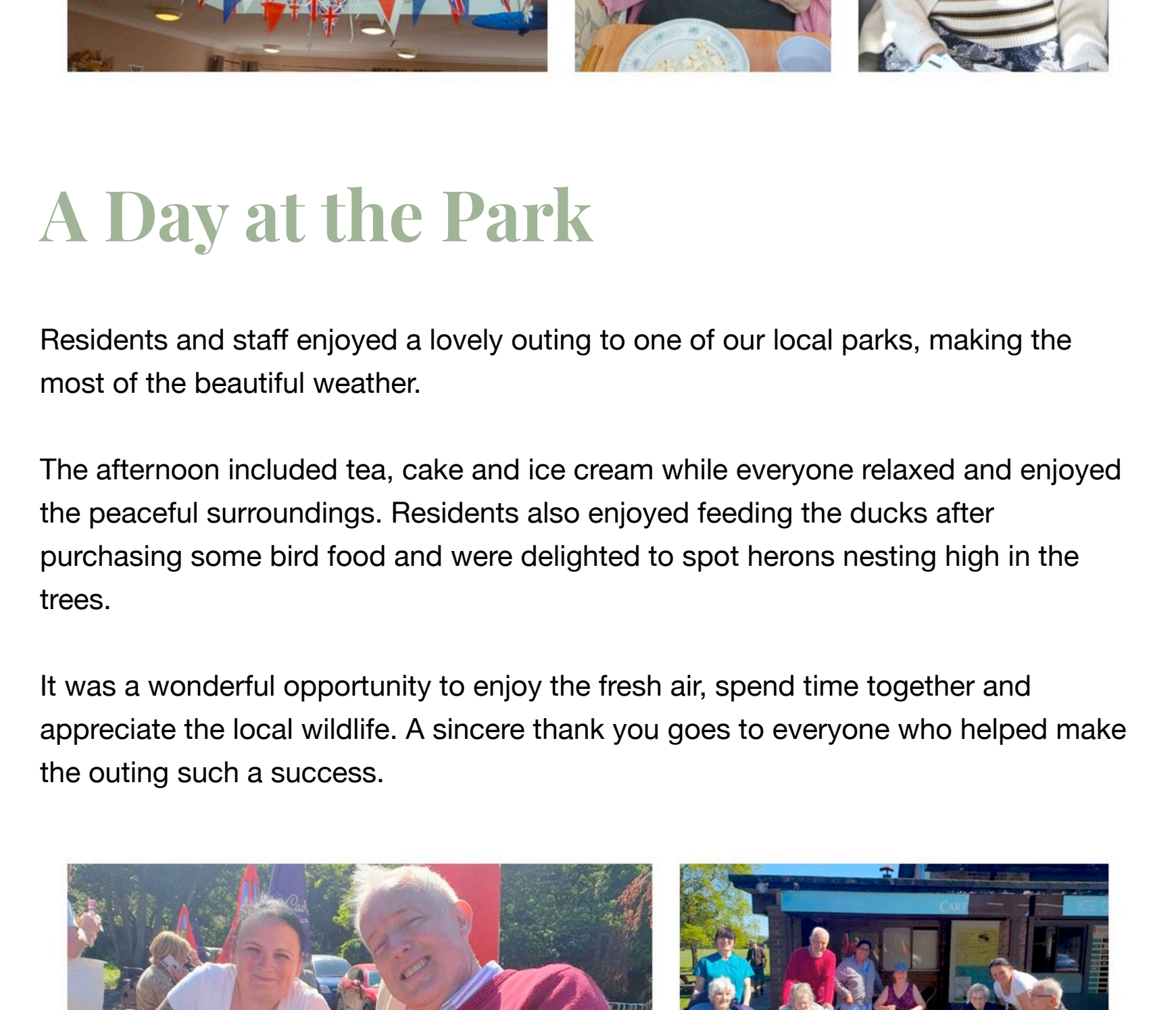


A Day at the Park
